of LB300 to the State Health Department. The State Health Department has had this responsibility since 1969. When the mobile home travel trailer construction bill was first passed by the Nebraska Legislature. Now the 69 legislation was an incomplete law and the inadequate appropriation allowed the department to act on a very limited basis and as such this left Nebraska as a potential dumping ground for units that did not meet the construction standards in other states having effective enforcement. Members of the Legislature this is an important piece of legislation in the mobile home housing. We need this bill passed this year. Let me give you a little history. Last year a very similar, almost identical bill was before this body, and it was accepted. But unfortunately we had other members of this body who were interested in adding too, adding an amendment. I would be hopeful that the two members who did participate in here and would verify the fact that consequently with the two amendments this bill was vetoed. I do not blame these two gentlemen. They were sincere in their efforts and their dedication to add to this and to cover another void in some other area. But I move for the adoption or move to advance LB300 from General File to E & R Initial.

CLERK: Motion on the desk Mr. President. Read Mahoney amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, this would merely change the word from shall to "may" and it would only take in the municipalities as political subdivisions of the state and it would require that the compliance of the codes which would take in what Senator Burbach has been a talking about to design the construction of the plumbing and the heating that the electrical installations having more stringent requirements than provided. So it would mean that just the two items, that municipalities and political sub-divisions which could have their own particular ordinances and laws which we do today anyway in other areas, such as fire compliance and fire division and so forth.

PRESIDENT: Discussion of Senator Mahoney's amendment. Senator Kelly.
