

LB 216

PRESIDENT: Read LB216. The rules are suspended.

PRESIDENT: There is nothing before us.

SENATOR SWIGART: I was still under suspension of rules and I thought that I could comment.

PRESIDENT: Not all the rules.

SENATOR SWIGART: I wonder if Senator Burbach could tell us what chances we had for reconsideration of these...

PRESIDENT: We have a lot of other lights on and I want to find out about...could you ask him privately Senator, because we're losing our body. Senator Johnson, Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, I move that we reconsider our action on LB 477, 394, and 409. They are the only three that were not advanced. I think that it is unfair.
