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state aid to education. I think a grade school arithmetic will tell you that the way the thing stands right now you're going to have to go with the Governor and sustain him on a lot of his vetos. There's no other way.

PRESIDENT: The matter before the house is Senator Frank Lewis' amendment. Might as well. We have an amendment ...

CLERK: It's a separate amendment.

PRESIDENT: We'll stand at ease for 60 seconds.

AT EASE

PRESIDENT: The Lewis amendment is an independent amendment so it is subject to an amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, the Lewis amendment ... Senator Keyes offers the following amendment to amend the Lewis amendment. Read amendment found on page 1940 in Journal.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, this is an amendment that should have been put on the bill before it went across. It just simply means that when you have a corporation doing the same business that a private individual does that you are not going to make him pay more taxes because he is a private individual than he does as a corporation. It also will bring back all those that make in the vicinity of \$50,000, \$75 or \$100,000 that their taxes on that business done in Nebraska will be about 60% of what a private individual doing exactly the same thing. These are actual figures and I can verify them. If you are a corporation doing \$50, \$75 or \$100,000 worth of business your taxes to the State of Nebraska are about 60% of what they would be if you were a private individual. There is no way that we can go ahead and do what we have done. We sent 123 over to the Governor and he has signed it. I'm surprised that there was probably 15 senators switched their vote this mornign. I don't know whether they know what they're doing or not. We are simply, this ... if we want to keep on and have some money here and let the Governor of this state run it with his vetos at 2 1/2, 11 and 123, we can do it. If 123 goes out of the picture it's either going to be 3 and 12 or 2 1/2 and 13 or 14. It's just that simple. I move for the adoption of this amendment of mine.

PRESIDENT: We're now on the Orval Keyes amendment. Senator Burrows. No, excuse me. Senator Carsten ... he's not here. Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I can't understand what happened this morning. I didn't know our Legislature had to go get permission of the corporations to pass laws. I think it's quite simple. If we can't support Senator Keyes amendment here we are saying that the individuals, the working people, the farmers and the small businessman are going to have to subsidize the tax bills in the state. We're going to have to pay a higher rate than corporations. We're saying
