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higher education, you'll notice that the enrollment in these schools in practically leveling off. This is not true in other areas of higher education. The projected enrollment for the next number of years is down and if inflation continues like it is, the cost of operating the local schools is going to have to go up and we're not going to have enough money to operate them with the projected school enrollment. I don't think this is enough money therefore I object to the Warner amendment. I don't think it will be enough money.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: I don't want to talk on the amendment. I want to talk on the bill.

PRESIDENT: There are no other lights on at this time, unless, Senator Warner. If there is no further discussion, the question is to adopt the Warner amendment. Would you please vote.

SENATOR WARNER: Do I get to close, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: Yes sir.

SENATOR WARNER: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, let me just repeat briefly what you are talking about is a 6 million dollar increase with the passage of 344, of the total amount that can be spent for the community colleges statewide. What my amendment does will essentially provide them the operating that was indicated needed by their original budget request and you do not end up which is being proposed in the original amendment with 6 million dollars of state funds and another 6 million dollars, approximately, of local property tax both to do the same thing. In other words, it's just an automatic increase. The only position of my amendment is that you make a decision whether this additional 6 million is going to come from state property tax and , state sources, sales income tax or whether you're going to double the increase by adding also 6 million in property tax and I would hope the body would collect it or I'm afraid we're going to see the expansion in the offerings in this area that's going to greatly increase state budgets for local community colleges for coming years.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall Senator Warner's amendment be adopted? Please vote. Have you all voted. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 25 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I think I'll have to ask for a roll call vote, Mr. President. I think it's significant to know which way the body wants to go.
