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physically unworkable and my question is for him to detail that, not a conclusion.

PRESIDENT: That would be argumentative, and the Chair would rule that out of order and not proper after a close. It would have been proper during the debate, Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Yes, but the foul ball of closing off debate didn't allow me that. My second question, Mr. President would be, is a medium, minimum, security facility, is that a prison?

PRESIDENT: Again, that's argumentative and I would have to rule that out of order.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR DICKINSON: A point of information and clarification, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are you asking the Chair?

SENATOR DICKINSON: You can make that decision whether it's yourself or Senator Luedtke may be able to answer it.

PRESIDENT: Well, Senator Luedtke has closed. Ask your question Senator.

SENATOR DICKINSON: The question was to Senator Luedtke. If he is saying it's impossible, is it possible to do what's he has suggested?

PRESIDENT: I don't understand the....

SENATOR DICKINSON: In regard to returning the bill and adding an amendment. I think we've been misled by a couple of speakers.

PRESIDENT: That's argumentative, I'm afraid I'll have to... Senator Koch, for what purpose do you rise? Senator Schmit? Well, I'm tired of having you light on, will you turn it off. The question is, shall 417 pass notwithstanding the Governor's objection? Record your vote. Please vote. Have you voted? Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I'll ask for,....okay.

PRESIDENT: Record.
