say OK because we got this existing situation here, because it's crucial and we don't want to hurt those people in that district, we're willing to go along with it. We're going to preclude this from happening again. The next time a class 6 school is formed they know that if there's a school district of the third class in a city of the first class they're going to annex out there.

SENATOR DICKINSON: When would this levy become effective if it's passed Senator? Ninety days after the end of the session?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yeah, I don't believe we have the emergency clause on it.

SENATOR DICKINSON: How many class 6 districts could we get organized before that became effective do you suppose?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Very few.

SENATOR DICKINSON: It would be possible, legally, time wise?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: They could, but I ...

SENATOR DICKINSON: Would this tend to force that happen?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: No.

SENATOR DICKINSON: It might. I think on the basis of this conversation I would have to oppose the amendment. I might oppose the whole bill. It seems like it's discriminatory to me.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Now may I close, Mr. Chairman?

PRESIDENT: No. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I believe my questions have to do with the bill itself, rather than the amendment; so I'll hold up.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Is this for purpose of closing, Mr. Chairman?

PRESIDENT: There are no other lights on.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Again I say that the committee amendment is to attempt to make the bill more palatable. In my judgement, without the committee amendment I think the bill would be unacceptable. I'd urge the adoption of the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 383. Record your vote. Please vote.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: There's been a request to have the amendment read, Vince.
