PRESIDENT: Record your presence. Please record your presence. Would you record your presence please Senators so we could get a quorum. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We go back to Final Reading. All Senators are to be in their chairs and no one other than Senators are to be on the floor. Please read for the . . . for Final Reading LB 577 Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Read title.

(mic turned off)

PRESIDENT: Please read LB 589 with the emergency clause.

CLERK: I have some reports to read in Mr. President.

Mr. President, your Enrolling Clerk respectfully reports that she, at this day at 1:30 p.m., presented to the Governor for his approval of the following legislative bills: LB 203, LB 213, LB 216, LB 237, LB 237A, LB 300, LB 325, LB 410, 453, 472, 507 and 522.

Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that they have carefully examined and reviewed LB 525 and find the same to be correctly enrolled; LB 525A correctly enrolled; LB 571 correctly enrolled; LB 571A correctly enrolled.

Mr. President, motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business I have signed LB 525, LB 525A, LB 571, LB 571A. Proceed Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move that LB 589 be returned to Select File to strike the enacting clause. Signed, Senator Keyes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, I move the the enactment of the amendment. Senators, I think each one of you know that the Governor of the State of Nebraska gave to the Revenue Committee a bill that was going to set the state income tax at 13 percent. He said he could operate the State of Nebraska at 13 percent. The bill came out of the committee at that. Now when it got on the floor of the Legislature, this bill, by Senator Warner, Senator Burbach and Senator Carsten. It has had three amendments put on it and they have stuck. The first amendment that Senator Warner has will say that the sales tax in Nebraska cannot go over 12 percent. Remember that the sales tax for this year cannot go over 12 percent.
