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the original, it says, including all wild animals pertaining to every person sixteen years of age or older who hunts for game animals, game birds, or takes bull frogs or any other species defined as game, and we are talking about game animals here. You have to have a license. Now in this bill you are talking about you have to have a license for nongame animals. That is the difference. Now nongame animals is the jackrabbit, raccoon, well, out of Senator Wiltse's new bill, I don't know how the raccoon will come, but opossum, coyote. No, crows are regulated these days. Well, some of these other things, you know what a nongame animal is, you have to have a license for them. Now insofar as Senator Carsten's bill of last session allowing the elderly to have a license permanently, I don't think this affects it but I would have to check it. But I don't think it does because, afterall, this is the first time I have looked at this thing since we adjourned and that has been a long time. Vince says, it is long enough. I don't think it affects it, no, and it doesn't do anything with the game animal part because you were always required to have a license for game animals. This is nongame animals and birds, but if you want to lay it over with Senator what-you-call-its consent and give him time to check that one point, it is all right with me but I don't think we are in trouble.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. Chairman, Senator Kremer, I don't want to have the bill laid over. I would like to have it go on but would you do it as a favor to me or to the body, would you have it checked to make sure that that provision for the elderly stays in and is not affected? He doesn't believe that it should affect it. I think he is right. But let's go ahead and try to pass the bill on, and by Select, you should have an answer so that you could tell us on that, if we need it. Would you be so good as to do that?

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Senator Barnett, I will be glad to do that, and the reason that I interpreted the present bill the way that I did and Senator Syas supported my position on it, if it would affect the provision of Senator Carsten's bill provided for, it also would, I mean, it would hold over in the same way here that it would on the bills that were previously passed. Those who are exempt from a license would still be exempt under the law that we passed at that time, but I will be glad to look into it, and if I am wrong, we can certainly bring it back to Select File and correct it later on because I do not want this bill to, in any way, change the position that we took when we passed legislation allowing certain people to be exempt so I will be glad to do it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Maybe we can get this down to Ada language. Senator Kremer, would you answer just a question or two for me just to get it straight for me. I have my
