CLERK: The next bill is Senator Frank Lewis' LB 167.

PRESIDENT: What is your pleasure, Senator?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, there is no way that I would debate this bill today. I ask to postpone that to, let's say, about March.

PRESIDENT: It will be bracketed until further..

SENATOR F. LEWIS: March 1.

PRESIDENT: Until March 1. Any objection? So ordered.

CLERK: LB 499 is the Labor Committee, Senator Maresh.
Senator Maresh is out of the Chamber.

PRESIDENT: It will be laid over until tomorrow. LB 346.

CLERK: Mr. President, a motion to bracket LB 346 until
January 26th. Signed Senator Fowler.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fowler moves unanimous consent. Is
there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 451 is by Senator Johnson relat-
ing to exempting the University from the Transportations
Services Bureau. Do you want to take that up? Pass over
that one. All right.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is
so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 232 is by the Banking Committee.
No, it was referred to the Banking Committee. It is by
Senator Keyes to change the interest rate.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, do you want to take this bill
up?

CLERK: LB 232.

SENATOR KEYES: I decided last year when the interest ceil-
ing was 9%, I felt that we needed this bill but now the
best thing we can do is let it die a natural death.

PRESIDENT: Are you making a motion to kill the bill?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question is, shall LB 232
be indefinitely postponed? Record your vote. Have you
voted? Record.
