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been pretty liberal, I think, with the land owner hunting on his own land. I don't think we should muddy up the water on this. Now a land owner He hunts deer. He can always get a license, every year, if he can't get one for the area, he can get one for his farm. He can hunt Upland game birds without a license. I think we've been pretty fair with the person that owned the land. This argument about Senator Stoney's child who couldn't hunt, but a farm boy can, that's the way it is now. If you get into Upland game birds Senator Stoney, or George Syas' son is going to have to have a license because I don't own any land. But your sons do not have to have a license.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Under this provision would my son, who lives on a 17 acre acreage, have to have a license to shoot a coyote on the farm that I operate?

SENATOR SYAS: Pardon now? Come again. Run....

SENATOR SCHMIT: You see I happen to live on an acreage that does not join the balance of my farm. Would my son or myself have to have a permit if I were to shoot a coyote on that farm, the major part of the farm?

SENATOR SYAS: For hunting what?

SENATOR SCHMIT: To hunt a coyote.

SENATOR SYAS: Well you're allowed to hunt anything on your farm, that's destructive to your property, without a license.

SENATOR SCHMIT: But then what is the purpose of the permit?

SENATOR SYAS: Well now ... now.... The people.... I'm out hunting, and say I'm hunting on your farm. A Game Warden comes up to me and says "Have you got a license?" and I said "No, I'm hunting jackrabbits and coyotes". The fact is that I may not be hunting jackrabbits and coyotes, but I don't have to have a license to hunt non-game birds and animals. The purpose of the bill is so that on law enforcement there will be no confusion, so that everybody has to have a license. If I'm hunting on your farm now, not if you're hunting. You're allowed to kill anything that's destructive to you on your own farm. But I'm not a farmer. So a lot of people get out of buying a license this way by simply saying I'm hunting jackrabbits. It makes law enforcement sort of a no-mans land in some cases. It's the same with the bill that we had last session on fishing. Well really you didn't have to have a fishing license in that case to fish for carp. But because they were non-game fish.... But when you drop your line in how do you know if you're going to catch a carp or a bullhead, or a bass? It's one of those things, again, that gets into some pretty wobbly places.
