PRESIDENT: Motion carries.

CLERK: I'm sorry, Mr. President. Senator Syas asked for a record vote.

Voting aye Senators Barnett, Bereuter, Burbach, Carsten, Clark, Dickinson, Duis, George, Kennedy, Keyes, Kime, R. Lewis, Luedtke, Maresh, Marvel, Nichol, Rasmussen, Rumery, Schmit, Simpson.

Voting no Senators Cope, Dworak, Fitzgerald, Fowler, Goodrich, Johnson, Koch, Kremer, F. Lewis, Mahoney, Marsh, Stoney, Swigart, Syas, Warner, Wiltse.

Not voting Senators Anderson, Burrows, Cavanaugh, Chambers, DeCamp, Hasebroock, Kelly, Mills, Moylan, Murphy, Savage, Skarda and Stull.

20 ayes, 16 nays, 13 not voting.

Mr. President, Senator Chambers has asked to be excused till he arrives.

Mr. President, Senator Barnett asks unanimous consent to insert some amendments in the Journal to LB 502.

Mr. President, a new bill, LB 723, Read title to LB 723.

Mr. President, Senator Fowler inserts in the Journal Urban Affairs notice of committee hearings.

Read title to LB 265. Mr. President, the bill was first considered on April 10, 1975, no further action was taken on it at that time. There are committee amendments by Senator Kremer's Public Works Committee.

SENATOR KREMER: I move to pass over the bill today. I'm attempting to get some information I do not have at this time.
