The League of Municipalities brought the bill in. They indicated that this is already in effect for first class cities. They felt that if it was good for that class it should also be instituted for the second class cities.

I'd move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT: The question is the advancement of the bill. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay.

PRESIDENT: In the absence of Senator Schmit we'll pass over 519. Is there any objection?

CLERK: Same is true of 544.

PRESIDENT: Alright.

CLERK: Read title to LB 519. There are no committee amendments, Mr. President. There are some amendments offered by Senator Frank Lewis which were printed in the old Journal and which are now in your Bill Books.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, Senator Warner has an interest in this particular bill. He's not here so I would request that we'd wait on him.

PRESIDENT: Any objection? Seeing none, it's so ordered. To a date certain, Senator, or just lay it over till tomorrow?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Why don't we just lay that over till Tuesday of next week.

PRESIDENT: To a date certain then.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Have we got that, Mr. Clerk? Tuesday of next week, whatever day that is. Is there an objection? Seeing none, it's so ordered. LB 299. LB 266. Senator Carsten asks for unanimous consent to lay over 266 until tomorrow. Any objection? Seeing none, it's so ordered.

CLERK: LB 248 is Senator Burbach's bill. Read title to LB 248. Mr. President, there are amendments. There is a committee amendment by Senator Kennedy's Public Health and Welfare Committee. There is then an amendment offered by Senator Bereuter. There are two amendments offered by Senator Bereuter to amend the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Mr. President, fellow members. Briefly I'll explain the committee amendments. There are a number of committee amendments. One would add the provision, Section 5, requiring the Department set up a compliance insurance program to insure that the manufactured units conform to the standards established. An amendment to
