CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have notice of Committee Hearings from the Government Committee signed by Senator Rasmussen, Chairman. That is all I have, Mr. President. Senator Duis asks to be excused tomorrow afternoon. Mr. President, I move to adjourn. Excuse me, here he is.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, we have completed and passed over many bills this morning, and those we have completed, why this is fine and I appreciate that we have. We have also gone through those bills which are bracketed until tomorrow, we have gone through the unbracketed General File also. So we have completed our work over on Select File, that work we can do. We have discussed that and taken care of it this morning. So I see no reason why we should be in session this afternoon. I know of no work that we could possibly do. So I am going to request that we adjourn, when we adjourn now that we adjourn until 9:30 tomorrow morning. I would like to plead and ask all of you to do the best possible chance that you can that we can go through this list again and do all the homework this afternoon that is necessary, refresh your memory or get the notes together. I did ask this morning that LB 180A be bracketed until the 28th and that LB 202 be bracketed until the 29th. I have been doing some work on them now and visiting with some of the departments here in the state and I am certain that I can bring up and discuss those two bills, and if we can all make some definite attempt for discussion, I think we will have a full day's session tomorrow, if we can accomplish this thing. So I plead with you to please be ready and let's not pass over any more bills than is absolutely necessary. So I now renew my motion that we adjourn until 9:30 tomorrow morning.
