PRESIDENT: Motion carries.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, we have the Fitzgerald amendment as amended by the Cope amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the Fitzgerald amendment as amended by Senator Cope. Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I want to just ask Senator Fitzgerald one question please. The question is, if we adopt his amendment will he support the bill on Final Reading?

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Yes.

SENATOR STULL: OK, thank you.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Fitzgerald's amendment. Record your vote. Have you voted? This is the \$9 bill. Have you voted? Record. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I'm going to ask for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Alright. There's a motion that the House go under Call. Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 16 nays.

PRESIDENT: We are not under Call.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 20 nays on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the question is the advancement then of Senator Cope's bill as amended.

SENATOR BARNETT: Would you announce

PRESIDENT: Oh, we're not under Call.

SENATOR BARNETT: Would you announce that it was adopted or not, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: Oh, that's right. The Fitzgerald motion failed then. Would you announce that again, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: The vote was 21 - 20.

PRESIDENT: It required 25 votes. Senator Murphy, for what purpose do you ask recognition?

SENATOR MURPHY: I was under the impression that Fitzgerald motion was an amendment to Senator Cope's amendment.

PRESIDENT: It was an amendment to the bill. He was moving the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you.
