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tax. We are only, and only, talking about state tax. The difference, again I say, is who pays and I think it is much more fairer in this way than under L^R 382, I should say. If you receive the money, pay it, pay your income tax. If you do not receive it, that entity of business in a community should pay their tax as they withhold it so I urge you to adopt the amendment and have a fair tax to the co-ops.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Burbach's amendment. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 28 nays, 8 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, the Duis amendment as originally proposed is found on page 240 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR DUIS: It has been discussed sufficiently, I am sure, and I ask the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. You have heard the question. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 39 ayes, 0 nays, 10 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The amendment is adopted. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: I believe there is an unanimous request on this bill up there.

PRESIDENT: Would you want to restate it?

SENATOR DUIS: I think there is something else attached to the bill, isn't there?

CLERK: Senator Burrows asked unanimous consent to withdraw his amendment yesterday.

SENATOR DUIS: Oh, he did. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Do we have an objection...oh, that was yesterday, Mr. Clerk? All right, then.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, then I ask for the advancement of the bill to E & R Initial, and I am not going to give a dissertation and I think we have spent two days and I thank you and I would ask for the vote.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the question. Record your vote on the advancement of the bill. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 41 ayes, 3 nays, 5 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Senator Cavanaugh, for what purpose do you arise? All right.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 502.

PRESIDENT: LB 502. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.
