PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I informed the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee yesterday that LB 789, which was to have a hearing next Thursday, would be a duplication of another bill that Senator Bereuter had and so I ask that the bill be removed at this time.

CLERK: The motion is, Mr. President, unanimous consent to return the bill from Miscellaneous Subjects Committee to General File.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Fine.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Then there is another motion there.

CLERK: Your next motion is to withdraw it. To do that, you have to lay it over. The alternative would be to kill it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: I move that LB 789 be indefinitely postponed.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. Any discussion. The question is, shall LB 789 be indefinitely postponed? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes on motion to indefinitely postpone. Now, Mr. President, Miscellaneous Subjects gives notice of a cancellation of a public hearing on LB 789. Signed Senator Anderson. Mr. President, your committee on Government, Military and Veterans Affairs to whom was referred LB 686 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File; LB 659 indefinitely postponed. Signed Senator Rasmussen, Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, I ask that LB 802 be withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the bill has been sent to Government Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, this has been referred, apparently to Government Committee. Would you ask unanimous consent to have it returned.

SENATOR KEYES: I will ask unanimous consent, then, to have it returned to the Legislature.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? LB 802. Senator Keyes wants to dispose of the bill. Seeing no objection, it is returned. Senator Keyes.
