a little bit. Every maternity case increases your rates. Every case of a broken leg, and you may have that, and it increases your rates. If you are going to write a specific insurance for a specific person for just that sickness that he thinks he ought to have or will have, then you will have a far different insurance than what we have. So the best thing to do with this policy is give to these people who have a handicapped or mentally retarded child the option, in group insurance, not the option, the privilege of having their group insurance policy include their children beyond the age of 23 and to make certain that they know that they are there they will have to notify the insurance company. I move for the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 6 nays, 17 not voting on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 629.

CLERK: LB 629 was introduced by Senator Stull. Read title. The bill was reported to the Judiciary Committee and advanced to General File with Committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Senator Luedtke will take the Committee amendments.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the Committee amendments on LB 529. The only amendment was a technical change in the wording on page 2 of the bill, lines 16 and 17, where you have a description of where the cause of action arose. It just rewords that to say "or when the cause of action arose within the county." It was felt that that would be a better description of what actually was intended by the bill which said within the county or where the cause of action arose. It didn't say where. So this now puts it the other way around, "or when the cause of action arose within the county." That is all.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. The question is the adoption of the amendments. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to adopt the Committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull.
