SENATOR SIMPSON: Sure.

PRESIDENT: All right. So the amendment has been withdrawn. Do you want to do anything else with it?

CLERK: The bill has been correctly engrossed and it should properly be placed back on Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: All right. Do you want to move to advance it to E & R Final.

CLERK: No, to Final Reading. The bill was on Final Reading when you brought it back.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, I would ask to have it advanced and then I want to have another motion to bring it back to Select File.

PRESIDENT: But you can make that at the time your specific amendment is ready.

SENATOR MARESH: All right. Thank you. I so move.

PRESIDENT: All right. The motion is to advance the bill. Any discussion. All right. The Clerk advises me that there will be a printing problem if we don't do this by machine vote. The question is, shall the bill be advanced to Final Reading? Record your vote. Please vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on motion to advance to Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: That is all we have on Select File. We go to General File now and we will commence with LB 519.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review reports we have examined and reviewed...your committee on Urban Affairs reports we have examined LB 776 and recommend it be placed on General File as amended; LB 790 General File as amended. Signed Senator Fowler, Chairman. Mr. President, Constitutional Revision reports LB 662 indefinitely postponed; LB 928 indefinitely postponed. Signed Senator Syas, Chairman. That is all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right. Mr. Clerk, please commence with LB 519.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 519 was introduced by the Committee on Agriculture and Environment. Read title. It was first considered January 20th and again on February 4th. The Committee amendments have been rejected, Mr. President. I believe that there is now pending amendments offered by Senator Schmit and on the Schmit amendment there is an amendment offered by Senator Simpson which is pending, to strike the words "or without" in line 7 of the Schmit amendment.
