presence of all members. Would the Sergeant at Arms find the other members of the Legislature and everyone please stay in your chairs during this Call? Senator Clark voting no.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no on the original motion. Senator Fitzgerald voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fitzgerald voting aye. Senator Moylan voting aye. Senator Duis voting nay. Senator Lewis moves to raise the Call. The question is, shall the Call be raised? All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. Report the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 9 nays on motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 31. No, LB 313.

CLERK: Senator Cavanaugh asks to lay over again until Friday.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? So ordered. LB 464.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp asked to lay that one over until February 11th.

PRESIDENT: Any objection? So ordered. LB 669.

CLERK: LB 669 introduced by Senator Kelly of the 35th District. Read title. There are no Committee amendments, Mr. President. There is an amendment offered by Senator Nichol.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol. Clear the Board, please.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, this bill provides for juvenile court in counties of 40,000 population. The law as now stated provides for over 50,000 population. My amendment would allow a juvenile court in counties of population 30,000 and more. I have checked with the...I believe I have checked with all of the Senators from the counties between 30,000 and 40,000 and I found no objection to this. This is, without going into the bill itself, this is permissive only by a vote of the people in the county. I move for the adoption of my amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly has reminded the Chair that the introducer has not had the opportunity to explain the bill. Senator Nichol, the discussion on your motion will then be held up until after Senator Kelly has discussed the bill.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay.

PRESIDENT: Thank you.
