CLERK: It is as follows: See page 635, Journal. Read amendment.

PRESIDENT: Commence the roll.

CLERK: Roll call and record vote taken. See pages 635 and 636, Journal. 15 ayes, 29 nays, Mr. President.

CLERK: I move to amend LR 106: Read amendment. Signed Senator Frank Lewis. See page 636, Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: If you are going to do this, at least, you ought to do it right. As I read the Constitution, I just talked to Hennegan in Hruska's office and he has got a person to call me back of how you officially do this and I think that based on what I have heard or read and in what I know that this is the way to make application as an official document and I assume that you will have to have some official record of the vote to make sure that it did have the majority of approval to make application for the Constitutional Convention. I would like to ask Senator Murphy a couple of questions.
