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this...whatever Senator DeCamp wants to do down and get on with our business.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I believe that it is important that we bring this bill back to the Legislature. It is my purpose to bring it back here not because of the Governor not signing it, but I'm afraid that he might sign it. I have never spoken with he or the members of his staff, but I am concerned that he might sign this bill. I have talked to several members of the Legislature who are concerned about their affirmative vote when 339 passed, and I believe that it is only right to give them a chance to reconsider their actions at this time. I would hope that you would move this bill back to reconsider those people who would like to reconsider.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I commend Senator DeCamp for giving us an opportunity to rectify our error. We certainly should bring this bill back and take another look at it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Anderson.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, members of the body. I am a little bit concerned about this action up when Senator Cope is unable to be here. I think that he does have an interest in this thing, and I realize that we have got a time schedule that we are up against, but I really think that it would be unfair to him when he is not here to defend his bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator F. Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I think that somebody said it over here under their breath, that if the bill is as bad as the proponents say it is, I'm sure that the Governor in his wisdom can do what he would like at this point and time. We have enough problems debating the bills that are in front of us, rather than passing them and bringing them back. Our image is real good now. That even makes it a little better. Senator Mills, I know, do you want to talk Senator Duis? Mr. Chairman, I yield one minute of my time to Senator Duis.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, it won't take but just a second. Some of us have not said a whole lot. None of these debates...the debates have been lingered on by a lot of talk here so if we can cut this a little shorter it would help.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I certainly wanted to give Senator Duis that time to speak, because I always wait with bated breath when he talks. I appreciate those comments
