considered by the Legislature. The Committee amendments were rejected. Senator Schmit, I believe, had offered amendments and then withdrew them. There is now pending Senator Rasmussen's motion to indefinitely postpone LB 519.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, with the permission of the body, LB 519 has had a torturous route and, you know, sometimes you are the victim of your own creation and that happened to me. I gave Senator Burbach unlimited authority by amending the rules here the other day to put bills in order of priority, and for some reason or other, 519, which was in the middle of a kill motion, dropped to the bottom of the list and this morning it faded farther in the stretch but it is back up now and showing a little strength but I would like to ask the indulgence of the body to let the bill or to bracket the bill for Tuesday because Senator Burbach and myself and Senator Rasmussen have been trying to put out some amendments, and maybe by that time, we will have them ready to go. So I would like to have you ask Senator Rasmussen to speak on it because we are in the midst of his kill motion, and if he wanted to pursue it, we could but I would prefer to wait until Tuesday if the body would concur.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, it is certainly agreeable with me.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rasmussen, the Chair did not hear what you said.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. Chairman, I agree with Senator Schmit that we take it up Tuesday.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, if we are going to set this off until Tuesday, I will so build it into the agenda. We do have another bill prior to this one that was discussed this morning set for Tuesday but I would like to call your attention to an amendment which is in the Journal on page 652 so you will take the opportunity to read it so we will know what we are discussing and we can move along rather rapidly on Tuesday, I would hope.
