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or cities and it says the counties shall withhold...the Governor shall withhold the money. Well, he doesn't really have the money so we include the State Treasurer with the Governor and it says the Governor and the State Treasurer shall withhold the funds and that is what it does. It is kind of a bulky bill but those are the changes. We have gone through these statutes several times and we are sure now that what we are repealing will not cause any problems. I would move for the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is the advancement of the bill. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Excuse me, the bill did advance, Senator Stull.

CLERK: LB 65 introduced by Senator Richard Lewis of the 38th District. Read title. There are Committee amendments by Senator Kennedy's Public Health Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Senator Kennedy, do you want to handle the Committee amendments. Okay. LB 65, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, was a bill that I offered last year and originally provided not only for an increase in fees, the fee schedule, to maintain the licensing program, the examination program, but also provided some criteria for determining the various levels of competency. This bill ran into some trouble and was held in Committee. We held it over the summer. We discussed this and eliminated those provisions that were originally built into the bill and the clinical psychologists offered amendments which now become the bill and I might just read from the forward here what, actually, we did with it. This bill had a hearing on January 20th and the proposed amendments now become the bill. These amendments were adopted by the Committee and they provide for as follows: (1) State Board of Examiners in Psychology authorized to enter into agreements with any state agency for the use of the services, personnel or facilities when they are thought to be necessary to carry out the provisions of the Psychology Licenser Law. The new bill will give the Board more flexibility in the setting of licensing fees. The law now provides that it may not fix a license fee in excess of \$50, nor a renewal fee in excess of \$5. These maximums would be changed to \$100 and \$50, respectively. Also the fee for a replacement would go from \$2 to \$10. The new bill adds to the provision relating to the suspension or revocation of licenses by the Board in addition by adding new conditions thereto to wit: Practicing in areas of psychology outside his area of competency, willfully misrepresentation, misrepresenting his professional qualifications and failing to use reasonable care in protecting the confidentiality of information obtained in his practice, and failing to make reasonable
