I ask that you uphold the Governors veto. Regardless of his motives, what he did is correct. The things that Senator Murphy said in opposition to the Governors veto, such as his saving the public, his having to slap the hands of the Legislature for doing something unwise and unfair, he's correct when he says that this time. When he comes again we might say the same thing, both of us Senator Murphy, next time. But on this occasion, despite his motives, his action is correct, it's pure.

PRESIDENT: Please close debate, Senator Swigart, with your reply.

SENATOR SWIGART: Mr. Chairman, colleagues. I would think that if these loan offices were not available that it would only increase, what John Cavanaugh mentioned, the going underground and borrowing money from individuals from 35 to 50 percent. I don't think we want more of that. I think we want them at least to be legal and out where you can see what they're doing. The only other point is, one-seventh of the small loan companies in Nebraska have gone broke in the last three years; I leave it up to you what you want to do about the rest of them.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall LB 477 become law notwithstanding the Governors objections. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Please vote. Record.

CLERK: Voting aye Senators Burbach, Carsten, Clark, DeCamp, Dickinson, Dworak, Fitzgerald, Goodrich, Hasebroock, Johnson, Kelly, Koch, F. Lewis, Luedtke, Marsh, Mills, Moylan, Murphy, Nichol, Savage, Simpson, Stoney, Stull, Swigart, Syas and Wiltse.

Voting nay Senators Anderson, Barnett, Bereuter, Burrows, Cavanaugh, Chambers, Fowler, George, Kennedy, Keyes, Kime, Kremer, R. Lewis, Mahoney, Marvel, Rasmussen, Rumery, Skarda and Warner.

Not voting Senators Cope, Duis voting aye. Not voting Senators Maresh and Schmit.

27 ayes, 19 nays 3 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Luedtke. Read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to withdraw my motion to override on 177. Signed, Senator Luedtke.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it's so ordered. We move to Select File. LR....

CLERK: Mr. President, I have some committee reports.

PRESIDENT: Alright, read them in.

CLERK: Your Committee on Constitutional Revision and Recreation, to whom was referred LB 812, instructs me to report the same to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File; 771 indefinitely postponed. Signed, Senator Syas, Chairman.
