SENATOR BEREUTER: Mr. President, that's my intention. I think it should be clear. I move for the amendment to the Dickinson amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of this matter? Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment to the amendment prevails. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Then we're back on Senator Dickinson's amendment. Senator.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Well I think the.... Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I think the amendment is needed, it's good and it's been improved by these two amendments. I simply now move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Further discussion? The question is the adoption of Senator Dickinson's amendment. Record your vote. This requires 25 votes. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have no further amendments on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh. No further amendments.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move the bill be advanced. This is an extremely significant piece of legislation, one that's been in the offing for over two years and will hopefully greatly improve the financial integrity of sanitary improvement district systems, provide protection primarily to the future owners of real estate within sanitary improvement districts and provide for the financial stability of the bond and warrant market connected with the sanitary improvement districts, all of which can only serve to enhance both the building and the industry, the development of residences in the State of Nebraska and protect future homeowners.

I think the bill should be advanced.

PRESIDENT: That's the question, shall the bill be advanced. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. In the South balcony there are 14 students from St. Mary's School here in Lincoln. These students come from both Senator Luedtke and Senator Fowler's districts. Thank you for coming. We hope you enjoy your day here in the Capitol.
