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what the State of Nebraska does just like sometimes we react and does accordingly. Yes, we could lose in the long run by this in my opinion.

SENATOR GEORGE: Could you tell me directly, with the Rasmussen amendment, would our nonresident fee be totally out of line in comparison to Iowa, for instance?

SENATOR SYAS: Well, you mean the raise?

SENATOR GEORGE: Yes, the raise.

SENATOR SYAS: I think the raise, generally speaking, would exceed Iowa.

SENATOR GEORGE: It would.

SENATOR SYAS: General speaking, not in all classes.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, members, this is one portion of the bill that I, too, had concern about and I raised the nonresident fees from what they were originally proposed. There is two problems in this nonresident area. As Senator Syas pointed out, when we talk about out of state people coming into Nebraska, we have to be a little bit concerned about reciprocal agreements because we do have a lot of people from Nebraska going to Colorado and Wyoming. We have a lot of people from Omaha who hunt in Iowa or anybody living on the border. So this is one part of it. Another part of it, all nonresidents ~~are~~ total strangers. You have people coming home for Christmas. People that are from Nebraska. People that live in Des Moines. People that live in Kansas City. They come home and sometimes over this week or two weeks they like to hunt, and so when the grandchildren come home, they fall in this nonresident category and so we think that we got a relatively reasonable compromise on this nonresident thing. It is something that I had raised from the original proposal. I again think Senator Rasmussen's idea, I know what he is thinking about is true but it is a little broader. We do have some nonresidents that we are not so concerned about. So to keep the bill relatively intact and to keep it what I think is a well thought out, worked out proposal, I would urge not to support this Rasmussen amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of this body, I want to talk briefly about the situation out at the west end.

PRESIDENT: Now does this relate to Senator Rasmussen's amendment?
