SENATOR F. LEWIS: There is a person that lives in Raymond Oaks, is that (inaudible), very close to the North end of Omaha.

SENATOR SYAS: But doesn't the person live outside of Omaha?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes, I guess it is outside the city limits.

SENATOR SYAS: So this would give you two, really, wouldn't it?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Well, we would have one that would be designated and the Governor would appoint that one to start with and then we would move it from there.

SENATOR SYAS: Until when, will he appoint?

SENATOR SYAS: What is the matter until the election?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Well, we might look at that as an amendment on Select File, if you would like. I would be happy to discuss it with you.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President and members of the body, it appears this bill is somewhat controversial. I have the same question that Senator Syas alluded to a moment ago, like rather than seeing an appointment serve six years, I think if we are going to do anything that this person should be appointed until the next election and no longer than that and so even though Senator Lewis thinks we can do it on Select File, I am not that I don't trust his word but I do believe this bill needs more discussion than we have right now.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis, we have five or six lights on. Considering the number of people here, do you want to pursue this matter?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: No, Mr. Speaker, if you would put that down for a regular date.

PRESIDENT: Do you move to hold this over until tomorrow?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: And try to make the rest of them controversial.
