SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Is that correct?

PRESIDENT: You are moving that after these bills are taken care of that any Senator may move their own bill. That might be in addition to the Speaker's order, Senator Burbach. Did you have anything to do after the non-controversial bills?

SENATOR BURBACH: I assumed that this would be a full afternoon's work and deliberation. I have no objections, if this body so decides they want a different order, they may do so with 25 votes but I will not be responsible for picking and choosing any one of the so-called non-controversial bills other than what I have indicated.

PRESIDENT: All right. In view of that, I think the motion is in order because it won't come into play until after the Speaker's orders have been exhausted. Record your vote on Senator Cavanaugh's motion. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 13 nays.

PRESIDENT: We go to LB 642, if we have any paper.

CLERK: LB 642 introduced by Senator Mills. Read title. There are Committee amendments by Senator Schmit's Agriculture and Environment Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the Committee amendments are very simple. If you check your bill book, they are simply technical amendments and do not affect the nature of the bill in any way and I move the adoption of the Committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Any further remarks, Senator Schmit?

SENATOR SCHMIT: No, I have no further remarks.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh. Oh, the question is the adoption of the Committee amendments. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays. There is offered an amendment by Senator Mahoney as follows: See page 840, Journal. Read amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is Senator Mahoney around?

CLERK: He is excused so I don't know if anybody else would move it for him or not.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move the bill be laid over.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, I object to that. I have
