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back that you paid to somebody who was subsequently reimbursed. Those are two separate things altogether and, Senator Kennedy, you lead people to believe that you only want the one but you reject the amendment that would do that and say that you don't want the other which the bill says that is the power that you are giving them. Now I just don't...I can't comprehend how you can describe a situation that way. It is wrong. The Department of Welfare should not have a civil litigation division that enters into trial...to try lawsuits in behalf or in spite of welfare recipients. It is simply not a correct function and I don't understand how the Health and Welfare Committee can justify it. I don't understand how the Department of Welfare can justify it and certainly this Legislature can't justify that kind of power in the Department of Welfare. I wish you would have accepted my amendment so that they could have addressed the problem that they say they want to address, but in the absence of that, this is a totally inappropriate way to deal with this situation and this bill should be killed.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the bill be returned to Select File for the specific amendment of striking the enacting clause? Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 28 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Read the bill.

CLERK: Engrossed Legislative Bill 239 introduced by Public Health and Welfare Committee. Read on Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 239 pass? Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: Record vote read. See pages 851 and 852, Journal. 31 ayes, 11 nays, 7 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill passes. Please read on Final Reading, LB 499.

CLERK: A motion on the desk, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: I move to return LB 499 to Select File for a specific amendment to strike the enacting clause. Signed Senator Savage.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, LB 499 is a workmen's compensation bill and it covers nonprofit organizations. It is an overreaction to the Hiram Scott situation. It calls for a 4.8 percent payroll permanent fund impound amounting to as high as a half a
