Signed, Senator Dworak, Chairman.

PRESIDENT: The agenda calls for 30 minutes of Final Reading. All Senators please remain at your desks during Final Reading. We will commence with the Clerk reading LB 426. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Read title to LB 426. (machine turned off).

Motion on the desk, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: I move to return LB 519 to Select File for specific amendment to strike the enacting clause. Signed, Senator Rasmussen.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, members of the body. There should have been, on your desk by now, an Attorney General's opinion which cast some very serious doubts on this bill. We've kicked it around two or three mornings. Rather than go into a full blown debate I would just ask for your help in returning it to Select File.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. The bill has been discussed many times as Senator Rasmussen has indicated. I have seen the opinion which he refers to. Actually I believe the opinion reinforces the validity of the bill rather than otherwise. I thank him for his opinion ... or securing the opinion.

I really don't see any reason to take the bill back. I think it has been discussed far more than many bills. I think the membership understands the bill. I think the membership has made up their minds. I think we've taken enough time and I would just as soon go ahead and vote on the bill on Final Reading and let the membership make up their mind and vote it up or down.
