Senator Dworak, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker, didn't you advise that when Senator Murphy initially brought this up that the Clerk would read this section by section.

PRESIDENT: The rules provide that the Clerk shall if any member requests, Senator Murphy said that he did not want to make that request but he hoped that Senator Lewis would discuss it section by section. Do you want it read section by section?

SENATOR DWORAK: I would appreciate it if we would go over it section by section. Yes.

PRESIDENT: What do you mean go over it?

SENATOR DWORAK: I would request that it be read section by section.

PRESIDENT: Alright, read the bill section by section Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have some reports.
