SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. You'll recall a couple days ago we debated this particular issue. What I'm attempting to do with this amendment is to make it consistent with what the Omaha School Boards policy is at the present time. It's a very benign amendment. I've discussed it with the School Board. There's no objection. I would suggest that you help me adopt the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the amendment. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, there's another amendment....

PRESIDENT: Do we have to move that bill?

CLERK: There's another amendment offered by Senator Stoney which was left pending on the bill from the last time it was considered, on March 2nd, and that is to amend the same line to reinstate the stricken word "date" and delete the underscored word "year". That motion is still pending.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, I'd like unanimous consent to ax that please.

PRESIDENT: To pass it? What do you mean?

SENATOR STONEY: Withdraw. I said ax but I meant withdraw.

PRESIDENT: Ax.

SENATOR STONEY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: OK. You "ax" unanimous consent. Is there an objection? Seeing none, it's so ordered. Do you want to advance the bill, Senator Stoney. Senator Stoney asks that the bill be advanced. All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

We now go to General File. LB 464.

CLERK: Read title to LB 464. The Committee amendments have been adopted. There was an amendment offered by Senator DeCamp which was adopted. There's an amendment offered by Senator Chambers to which an amendment offered by Senator Barnett to amend was offered.

Mr. President, the Chambers amendment is pending. There's a Barnett amendment to the Chambers amendment which was adopted. There is now a DeCamp amendment to the Chambers amendment which is pending.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.
