SENATOR MARESH: No, last year it had bonding provisions and this seemed to be the objection to your Committee at that time so this was taken out. All it allows for is to be taxed up to a half mill. It has to be.... A majority of the people have to sign a petition so there are safeguards in the bill.

PRESIDENT: Please report your presence. Senator Schmit.

PRESIDENT: Call the roll. Yes.
