CLERK: Mr. President, motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Read Mahoney amendment found on page 996 of the Journal.

SENATOR MAHONEY: What this does is reduces it down from \$10 to \$6.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas. I know, but he's finished with his argument. Do you have any response to that? The question is Senator Mahoney's amendment to the amendment. Record your vote. Please vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 14 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion prevails. Senator Schmit, do you wish to be heard on the Syas matter once again? Your light is on. Senator Syas, would you close debate on your amendment.

SENATOR SYAS: Well this is not my amendment. I accept that, naturally.

PRESIDENT: Well that one passed.

SENATOR SYAS: Well that's amendment as amended now, isn't it?

PRESIDENT: Yes. So we have your amendment as amended by Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR SYAS: Well if Senator Mahoney could then.... I endorse the amendment as it now exists.

PRESIDENT: That's your close.

SENATOR SYAS: I do urge the Senate to vote for this bill. It will help a lot. It's not exactly as much as I'd like, but it certainly will help a lot of people. I think it's a compromise situation. I urge you to vote favorably on this amendment as amended.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Please vote. Have you all voted? Alright. Six of those are in the fifteen, so that leaves you nine. Alright, he's got a right to put it under Call. The question is shall the House go under Call. Senator.... Alright. But first of all we have to vote on whether to go under Call. Record your vote on that proposition. Record.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 23 nays to go under Call.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Report the vote on the original proposition. We already have the.... Wasn't that in the event of a Call? Alright, call the roll.
