SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, I understood that Senator Mills was not objecting. I had amendments drafted....

PRESIDENT: He is.

SENATOR MARESH: You do?

PRESIDENT: Do you want to make the motion to bracket it until March 11th Senator?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion on the motion? Senator Mills.

PRESIDENT: Oh, you are not objecting? Is there another objection? Senator Maresch withdraws his motion. Seeing no objection it is so ordered. Please read on Final Reading LB 670.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kremer and Senator R. Lewis would like to be excused at 10:30 this morning until 12:00 noon.

Read LB 670.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, "Shall the bill pass?" Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 42 ayes, 1 nay and 6 not voting. Vote appears on page 1029 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: LB670 passes. Please read on Final Reading LB 715. (machine turned off) Rumery.

SENATOR RUMERY: I would like to ask unanimous consent to bracket this bill until Friday, March 12th.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Senator Duis objects.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, may I state my objection?

PRESIDENT: No...well you just object and then he will have to move. Would that be alright?

SENATOR DUIS: No, I don't want to object to it except that I am interested in knowing why it must be....

PRESIDENT: Well there is an objection. Would you make a motion.

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President, I move that we bracket LB 722 until Friday, March 12th.

PRESIDENT: Now, would you care to discuss that motion?
