CLERK: Mr. President, there is a motion to return 642 to Select File for a specific amendment offered by Senator Marsh. He now asks unanimous consent to withdraw that motion.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is done.

CLERK: Read LB 642

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB667 Constitutional Amendment be advanced for engrossment. Are there amendments on it Vince?

CLERK: I don't even have the amendment...I mean the bill, just a minute. Alright Mr. President, we have the amendment now. LB667, there is an amendment offered by Senator Burrows which was left pending from March 4th. Read amendment. Then there is a Goodrich amendment to amend the Burrows amendment by adding, "related business".

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I'm going to ask unanimous consent to withdraw my amendment to his amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered. Senator Burrows.
