PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, I thought that I would be one to talk on that issue and clarify it....

PRESIDENT: Oh, well....

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I think that we agree that what they are doing is precluding a person, or forcing a person into a... their original amendment forced a person to make an election as to whether or not he would retire or receive workmens compensation if he were eligible to retire. Now they are forcing him to make an election as to whether or not he is even entitled to any of these benefits. He can't even find out. If he attempts to find out, he can't get his unemployment compensation. So, they are going from bad to worse.

PRESIDENT: And they agree to that Senator?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I think that they did, yes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Hold it, hold it. Mr. President, Senator Chambers had the motion to split the question. I want to amend the amendment to read so that it strikes the new language on page four but instead of inserting the new language on line 13, put that language into line 18. It has applied to receive.

PRESIDENT: Alright, would you put that in writing and bring it to the Clerks desk. Senator Simpson. And, were still talking on the first part of this split question. Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. In talking about this in the total issue I guess that Senator Murphy got up and made a statement which is absolutely untrue and very misleading. This section covers all disqualification not just people that voluntarily quit or are fired for cause. The total disqualification section and there are many other reasons besides this which are involved including the one that we are talking about right now, which is an entirely different issue. I wouldn't want the people here to be misled in thinking that they are talking about one little section of this when you are actually talking about the whole issue.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, keeping in mind that Senator Mills....do you have that amendment now?

CLERK: Read the Mills amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers could I recognize Senator Mills first so that he could discuss his amendment? Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Cavanaugh was correct when he read in the language that has applied to receive workmens compensation benefits for disability. I did not mean to touch upon that in any way. So I have asked in this amendment to put the wording in has
