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indifferent in and of itself. Legislators and legislatures can take innocent conduct and make it violated of the law. Can make it into a crime by saying that it is a crime. You are not going to solve or correct any abuses that you are doing here what you are going to do is take innocent conduct and place a penalty on the person who engages in that conduct which is right now innocent. I don't see anything wrong with applying for Social Security and unemployment compensation. Receiving the two types of compensation at the same time would pose an entirely different matter. If I sit here and contemplate stealing some money, then I can think anything that I want too and it is not against the law. I can walk into whatever the establishment is that has the money and I can even ease the place and that is not a violation of the law, it is open to the public and I am in there during business hours. But when my conduct begins to put me in a position to deprive that individual who owns the money of proper and legal ownership of that money, then I have stepped across the law and my conduct begins to interfere with the rights of someone else and I have violated the law. You are attempting to take innocent conduct, which harms nobody, and impose a penalty for engaging in that innocent conduct and I am totally opposed to it. I hope that you will not adopt this well intention, I can't even say that. I hope that you will not adopt this amendment that is being offered by Senator Dworak and Senator Mills, or whoever is doing it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills will you close debate on your amendment. That is all that were discussing now.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I want to only express the philosophy of what were trying to do here is saying that those people who should be, and have rightfully so, the uses of unemployment compensation which it was designed for, and that was for unemployment. It was not for, to aid and abet another fund. I would ask you to adopt this amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Mills amendment to the first part of his amendment to LB819. Record your vote.

CLERK: Senator Mills that is line 18 on your amendment, right?

PRESIDENT: Please vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 8 nays on the motion to adopt the Mills amendment to the Mills amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Now Mr. President....

PRESIDENT: It is adopted.

SENATOR MILLS: Now Mr. President, I would ask that you would adopt the second part of the amendment....

PRESIDENT: NO, no, we haven't adopted the first part yet. We have only adopted your amendment to the first part.
