CLERK: Read title to LB 1011. Mr. President, a motion on the desk. I move to suspend the rules and place 1011 directly on General File. Signed, Senator Marvel.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. Are you ready for the vote? The question is the suspension of the rules to put this bill on General File. Record your vote. Please vote. We'll go under.... Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 9 nays.

PRESIDENT: Who moved that? Senator Marvel, do you want the vote announced or do you want to go under Call?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well I think it's up to Senator Stull. I have not supported this bill and I'm not going to push it.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Senator Stull. We haven't announced

SENATOR STULL: It takes 30 votes to put it on General File?

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR STULL: OK. I'll move that we go under Call again.

PRESIDENT: Alright. The question is shall the House go under Call. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record your vote. Record it, Vince.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 5 nays to go under Call.

PRESIDENT: We are under Call. Please return to your desks and record your presence. Record your presence please. All members are to be at their desks when we're under Call. Record your presence.

CLERK: Senator Simpson voting aye on the original motion. Senator Fitzgerald voting aye on the original motion. Senator Savage and Skarda voting aye on the original motion. Senator Moylan voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills, did you vote aye?

CLERK: Senator Fowler voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull moves that the Call be raised. All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The Call is raised.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 9 nays, remainder not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is introduced ... or the rules are suspended and it's placed on General File.

CLERK: Senator Nichol asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 690.

PRESIDENT: We go to General File now. LB 691.
