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about this and tell you a funny story until he told about the arrow shirt, but seriously, I do think that this is a beautiful spot that we could spend a little bit of money and improve it greatly. It has a great deal of history to it and those of you have been through it know that it is a beautiful spot and I strongly support...solicit your support for this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, as a friend of the west and as a historical buff I speak in defense of Senator Mills, because I have personally, I have personally been at the Ash Hollow historical site, and Senator Pieper it is probably one of the most beautiful sites that we have in western Nebraska. This money is well needed and it will be great for the State of Nebraska to invest to show the people in western Nebraska as they come down from the Ft. Robinson area into the Scottsbluff Monument area that truly in the center of all of this that we have a great historical site. I strongly urge you as Senator Nichol said to see that this site is deserving of these funds. I hope that the Legislature will support Senator Mills.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, a question of Senator Mills. Senator Mills what assurance do you have that the \$211,000 would be spent in the next ten years?

SENATOR MILLS: Senator Kelly, it is the amendment...the amendment would read exactly that that \$211,500 goes for the visitor information center with the information that I sent around to you showing certain histories and all of that, that it actually goes into visible property there at the park. The park is paid for, it is there, and everything is done except this. I don't know how much more assurance you could have than to put it in the statutes.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you very much Senator Mills. Except for my first session in the Legislature we have had amendments from the floor to the Games and Park Commission to finish something that they started ten years ago. We are right on schedule with Senator Mills amendment that the Games and Parks Commission wants to finish what they started ten years ago. If you remember in my first session we didn't have that amendment because under Senator Carpenter's tutelage we accepted the Governors budget in total and amended nothing. I am sure that if that hadn't happened we would have had a request from the Games and Park Commission to finish something that they had started ten years ago. I oppose the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator F. Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I rise to support the Mills amendment. We obviously have already made a commitment in terms of \$20,000 capital out...cash outlay for the program statement. I was a little concerned there when he started to talk about arrow shirts, as a Choctaw from southeastern Oklahoma I didn't want it to turn into one of those kind of
