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deals. But, I have been there myself personally, it is a very nice area, it is a project that has been on the boards. I think that with modest increase costs here that we can certainly finish up the project, so I rise to support Senator Mills.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I am going to support this amendment. It seems to me that in the time that he has been here Senator Mills has been one of those that has taken a good look at the recreational areas out in the state historical sites and has been very concerned about them and he has brought several of them to the appropriations committee. Now, that he has a program statement on this area, I have seen it and I believe that it is a fine area and should be completed and I hope that we would adopt his amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Orval Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Lt. Governor, I thought that maybe because I had not talked very much that you had forgotten my name, but I am so thankful that you remembered. Senator Mills, I am going to support your amendment. I want you to know one thing. That having dealt with the Game Commission for eight years, I find that the wheels of progress grind fine, but they grind exceedingly slow. Anything that you wish to do with the Game and Park Commission will not take six months or a year like a normal person would get it done, but it will take three or four years. So, if we start this \$200,000 I hope that your hair is not perfectly white when the building is finally built. I will certainly support this amendment. It is needed. This building, and I stood out there in those tracks that come down across that bank, and I have marveled at that and I think that every young child in Nebraska should have some place like that in Nebraska to go and understand what our forefathers went through to develop this country. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills, do you want to close debate on this matter?

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, I will be very brief. I think that the members here are in support have outlined to you the importance of our heritage, the Indian heritage and the pioneers coming forth....Nebraska and going across those trails and leaving us that history. The only thing is that it should be shown to people so that money we have already expended can produce the affect that they were meant for. I will say one more thing in comment to Senator Keyes. That if this appropriation is done, Senator Keyes, I'm going to be on the back of Game and Park Commission to see that that is done. I would ask you to support this.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Mills amendment. Record your vote. Please vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President.
