Speaker's order only. Sir, that's all I know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, then I'm going to challenge what the Speaker has done unless he'll add 1009 after that one.

PRESIDENT: You want to challenge the Speaker's order now?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If he agrees to add 1009, I won't challenge him.

PRESIDENT: After this?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: After...

PRESIDENT: After 926?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Because it didn't advance but it wasn't killed yesterday.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, doesn't the record show that Senator Savage changed his vote at the last moment on the vote of that particular bill and that can be considered tomorrow or this afternoon. I don't care. That's the progress of the legislature because that is pending legislation left over from yesterday.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to put it in the Speaker's order then? Yes, you don't need it, you can just move again.

SENATOR BURBACH: Well we did not move to reconsider. Just for purpose of consideration. You can, according to that Senator Chambers, you can move, or Senator Savage, probably, could be the one.

PRESIDENT: Well then shall we add 1009 at the last of the Speaker's order? What? Alright, let's proceed with the... Senator Anderson, you have an amendment to the committee amendments to 987?

CLERK: Mr. President... Read committee amendment found on page 1346 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Okay, this again is a corrective measure. We are in our statutes now attempting to make sure that we consistently use the term "chairperson" instead of the reference to the male chairman so I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Alright. There are some lights on but I take it that's not to discuss this amendment. Then the question is the adoption of this amendment. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to adopt the Anderson amendment.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the amendment is adopted. Now, Senator George, do you wish to address yourself to the committee amendments as amended?
