PRESIDENT: It would be up to him. Commence the roll.

CLERK: Senator Anderson--

PRESIDENT: Well you're withdrawing your request for a roll call? It's withdrawn. Report the vote.

CLERK: Senator Nichol voting aye. Senator Stoney voting aye. Senator DeCamp voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis voting no.

CLERK: Senator Dick Lewis voting no. Senator Marvel voting no. 31 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, 2 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. The bill becomes law notwithstanding the Governors objection. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I have an "A" bill up there next.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to override.... The motion is that I move that LB 761A become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I think everybody understands the issue. This is to finance it. I'd ask you to override.

PRESIDENT: Alright, clear the board please. Mr. Clerk. clear the board. That's the proposition. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: Voting aye Senators Anderson, Barnett, Bereuter-, Burbach, Burrows, Carsten, Cavanaugh, Chambers, Dickinson, Fitzgerald, Fowler, Goodrich, Johnson, Kelly, Keyes, Koch, F. Lewis, Luedtke, Mahoney, Marsh, Mills, Nichol, Rumery, Savage, Schmit, Simpson, Stoney, Swigart, Syas, Warner and Wiltse.

Voting nay Senators Clark, Cope, DeCamp, Duis, Dworak, George, Hasebroock, Kennedy, Kime, Kramer, R. Lewis, Maresh, Marvel, Moylan, Rasmussen, Skarda and Stull.

Not voting Senator Murphy.

31 ayes, 17 nays, 1 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 761A becomes law notwithstanding the Governors objection. Do you have anything on 794?

CLERK: Mr. President, I move that LE 794 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor. Signed, Senator Fowler.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: Shall I move the Call be raised?

PRESIDENT: Alright. All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The Call is raised.
