subjects if they so desire. So on a motion and approved by the Executive Board we approved, we referred and sent back here to the Legislature that since committees do have the powers to study these subject matters which fall within the purviews of the committee we have done so.

Senator Barnett, if you're ready with me here I think that if you'll get your sheet out. The eleven resolutions that were sent back to committees was LR 111, Senator George, sent to the Public Works Committee.

Senator Barnett, would you continue on with your sheet.

SENATOR BARNETT: Public Works got LR 111, 131. Appropriations got LR 137. Health and Welfare got LR 138. Public Works got LR 140. Appropriations got LR 145. Appropriations got LR 152. LR 155 was sent to the Rules Committee with an amendment that there will be no expense for the meeting. LR 161 was sent to the Public Health Committee. Appropriations got LR 173 ... LR 173 went to Appropriations. LR 177 went to Government. Telecommunications got LR 190. That was the total.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Is that it, Senator Barnett?

SENATOR BARNETT: That gave every committee ... I mean that gave every resolution a committee.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. You did hear the verbal report. If you had your pencils there it will be on your desk very shortly because the Legislative Council Secretarial Staff is now in the process of finishing the typing and making individual copies to place on your desk which will bear out the verbal testimony of Senator Barnett as to the eleven resolutions sponsored by individual Senators that had to be placed in individual committees. So, Mr. President, our motion is ... and the motion the Clerk now has there, I think, available to read.... Did you send that for a copy? Alright. Will it be back to you very shortly? SENATOR MAHONEY: The report will be placed on each Senators desk.
