ASSISTANT CLERK: Read title to LB 146, LB 147, LB 148 and LB 149.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I would like to explain to this august body about Resolution Number 1. Resolution Number 1 was introduced at the request of the Lincoln Quilters Guild. The quilt, which is currently being opened for display, has won "Best of Show" in the National Quilting Organization in the United States. This is the original medallion style quilt. It is composed of both piece and appliqued borders. The inspiration for the design came from the artistic and architectural features found in the Nebraska State Capitol. You can see the design which is taken from the ceiling of the Supreme Court Room, you can see the center medallion which is taken from the mosaic floors in the center of the Capitol. This was considered the "Best of Show" of all the quilts in the United States. It was because of this, and the fact that the Quilting Guild had a statewide contest, that this resolution was offered to the body. This quilt has been given to the State of Nebraska Historical Society. It will be on display at the Nebraska Center for Continuing Education. I felt it was a distinct honor that Jo Ann Maxey, Senator Maxey and I were offered the opportunity to introduce this resolution. If there are any questions relating to this I would be very glad to answer any of them. This was made by the Lincoln Quilt Guild, and a number of different women worked on this and won this national award. Jo Ann, are the award things inside, on display too? Not only did it win first prize in its category, but it won "Best of Show". This brings a great deal of honor to the State of Nebraska, nationally. As women, Senator Maxey and I felt this was a great honor and wanted to be a part of this bicentennial project for Nebraska. Thank you, Mr. President.
