PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. The Pages are already, as Senator Marvel has indicated, passing out a slip which has three suggested times, at 9 to 1:00 tomorrow morning, 1:30 to 3:30 tomorrow afternoon, and again 9:00 to 11:00 on Thursday. Also it is indicated, that if those times are not convenient and you wish to make arrangements for an individual discussion with someone on the staff, that possibility would also exist, although it would be necessary for you to contact them and indicate when you would like to do that. It will, roughly, run a couple of hours. If you would indicate whether, and sign those sheets, any of those times that we can plan for it we would appreciate it if the Pages would pick them back up in a few minutes.

PRESIDENT: Introduction of bills, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a series of new bills for introduction. (Read title to LB 157, LB 158, LB 159, LB 160, LB 161, LB 162, LB 163, LB 164, LB 165, LB 166, LB 167, LB 168, LB 169, LB 170, LB 171, LB 172, LB 173, LB 174, LB 175, LB 176, LB 177, LB 178, LB 179, LB 180, LB 181, LB 182, LB 183, LB 184, LB 185, LB 186, LB 187 and LB 188). That is all, Mr. President. Mr. President, Senator Mills asked to be excused for the morning. Mr. President, Education Committee gives notice of hearings. Signed, Senator Frank Lewis, Chairman. Mr. President, your Committee on Appropriations gives notice of a committee hearing on January 18th. Signed, Senator Warner, Chairman. Mr. President, there is pending a motion by Senator Keyes to withdraw LB 25. The motion was introduced late yesterday and laid over.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes request to withdraw LB 25 requires a machine vote. That is the question. Please record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, 13 present and not voting, 11 absent and not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The bill is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Boughn and Dworak asked to be excused for the balance of the day.

PRESIDENT: We move to General File. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Read title to LB 1.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I move for the advancement of LB 1 to E & R initial. I might explain to the new members in the Legislature that the first eight or nine bills here are strictly revisor bills. They are brought to us by the draftsmen to correlate, to correct language and to do everything that can be done without legislative action. I'll give a brief one-line explanation of each one of these as it comes up. With this one, on LB 1, it correlates with other language found in the statutes regarding the removal of officers by the mayor. I'd move for the advancement of LB 1 to E & R initial.
