SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I just might announce that for your information, I know you know it but I'll just remind you that Monday will be the tenth legislative day. I've been advised that the Bill Drafter feels there is no problem in getting them all to us by Monday. Most of them are in your hands now. We should have an orderly process on Monday, the tenth legislative day. Chair recognizes Senator Savage. Motion to adjourn until 9:00 a.m., Monday. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. We are adjourned until 9:00 a.m., Monday.
