LB 47, 50

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature. We handled LB 50 on General File yesterday. As I understand it I may ask for unanimous consent to advance LB 50 from E & R initial to Select File today.

CLERK: The bill is on Select File. You can take it up on Select File.

SENATOR NICHOL: Excuse me. Advance to what?

CLERK: E & R final.

SENATOR NICHOL: E & R final. Excuse me. I m... spoke. I ask for unanimous consent to advance it to E & R final.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol's request is within the rules if there is, in fact, a unanimous consent. Is there an objection to Senator Nichol's request? Seeing none, the request is granted. You may move then to advance the bill. Oh, excuse me. There are amendments. Alright. Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. Chairman, I move the E & R amendments on LB 50 be approved.

PRESIDENT: Discussion? You have before you the Enrollment and Review amendments to LB 50. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. They are adopted. Senator Cullan, would you advance the bill please.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. Chairman, I move that LB 50 be advanced to E & R final for ergrossment.

PRESIDENT: That is the question, the advancement of the bill as amended. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, two more notices of committee hearings. Education gives notice of hearings. Signed, Senator Frank Lewis, Chairman. Miscellaneous Subjects. Signed, Senator Dworak, Chairman. That is all I have, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: In the South balcony we have 13 Gresham public school seniors. We appreciate you young people being here. They are accompanied by their teacher, Dave Goswick. That is in Senator Bereuter's district. Thank you for coming. We appreciate visiting groups. Anything further?

CLERK: Mr. President, there is a rules change being offered by Senator Barnett which will be in the Journal. Referred to the Rules Committee.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker, do you have anything for the organization?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: No.

PRESIDENT: Would you like to make your motion.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I will move, then, to adjourn until 9:00 a.m., tomorrow morning.
