PRESIDENT: Airlight. Do you have bills, Mr. Clerk?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: By the way, Mr. President, that will only take a few minutes. We would just ask that the committees excuse themselves for a few minutes to come to have that, and then go right back to their hearings if they can do that. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Proceed with the reading of new bills, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a notice of committee hearings by Business and Labor Committee. Signed, Senator Maresh, Chairman. Mr. President, a new bill. (Read title to LB 473). Mr. President, we have another bill for introduction. (Read title to LB 474). The bill was introduced by the Public Health Committee. There is a motion for the introduction of said bill. Mr. President, the motion is, I move for the introduction of a bill request number 738. Signed. Senator Richard Lewis.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I was going through some information here. You're referring to the bill that the Public Health Committee is introducing. This was introduced as a committee bill, at the request of the State Mental Health Board, which was created by action of LB 806, the mental commitment bill. It setup a temporary board which is going out of existence, by statute, February 11th. This bill permits transfer of cases and an appeal procedure for those people that have been committed to mental institutions, and provides a recourse and an appeal procedure for those people. I would move the introduction of this particular bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? This is a record vote requiring 30 votes. The question is shall this bill be introduced. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, 15 not voting, 10 present and not voting, 5 absent and not voting. (Read title to LB 474).
