SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Is everybody registered? Record.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Are there any reports on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Appropriations to whom was referred LB 193 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File as amended. Signed Senator Warner, Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Government to whom was referred LB 29 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File; LB 84 indefinitely postponed. Signed Senator Rasmussen, Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Revenue reports LB 16 indefinitely postponed; LB 26 indefinitely postponed; LB 32 indefinitely postponed. Signed Senator Keyes, Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Urban Affairs to whom was referred LB 13 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File as amended. Mr. President, notice of Committee Hearings. Appropriations gives notice of hearings. Signed Senator Warner. Banking and Commerce and Insurance gives notice of hearings. Signed Senator Mills. And Senator Dworak signs for a notice of hearings on Miscellaneous Subjects. Mr. President, that is all I have. I have a bill on Select File, LB 82. There are no E & R amendments.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I move LB 82 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.
